The drive to your hotel, 25 minutes' drive away from the international arrivals Arrive and check in at the Boma hotel Nairobi.

After check in have an optional time at leisure experiencing the hotel facilities



## NAIROBI CITY

*East Africa's most cosmopolitan city, Nairobi is Kenya's beating heart, an exciting, maddening concrete jungle that jarringly counterpoints the untrammled natural beauty to be found elsewhere in the country.*

*With a fabulous national park on its doorstep, some wildlife-centric attractions, the excellent National Museum and a series of quirky sights, Nairobi's reality – like that of so many places with a bad reputation – will often come as a pleasant surprise.*

Later evening proceed to the carnivore for a feast. Meats are roasted on traditional Maasai swords over a huge charcoal pit that dominates the restaurant's entrance. The rough-hewn beams combine the rustic feel of a rural setting with that of a medieval banqueting hall.

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Breakfast at the hotel

After breakfast, proceed on your drive to Aberdares national park

Arrival at the base hotel for check in and lunch, later proceed on your transfer to the Ark Lodge

Afternoon game viewing at the hotel balcony

## THE ARK LODGE

*Set in the heart of the Aberdare National Park, iconic and yes, quirky. The Ark overlooks a floodlit waterhole and salt lick, which attracts a host of awesome wildlife. Resembling and named after Noah's Ark, The Ark comprises of three decks from which numerous balconies and lounges provide a superb location for wildlife to be seen. So that you don't miss any animal sightings, the night guard will buzz your room when special animals come to the waterhole. The Ark has four viewing areas for observing the ever-present animal activity.*



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*There is also a ground level bunker – the perfect hideout for the discerning photographer. This is a circular pillbox-like structure, and it is from this vantage point that pictures of animals on the salt lick only yards away may be taken through the view holes in complete safety.*

*"In this intimate recess one can almost, but not quite, pat the animals, hear their sounds and smell the aroma of the night. This is a magical corner, where there is close contact with the essence that tells of an unexplored Africa, and where, very often, the visitor may enjoy in solitary state the beauty of it all."*

**Day 03 14JUL MON**

**Aberdares – Lake Naivasha**

Breakfast at the lodge

**0730hrs** – after breakfast depart to Lake Naivasha region with leisurely stops along the way including at the Great Rift valley view point.

**1330hrs** – Arrival in time for warm welcome you will be offered free welcome drink as you check in, assisted to your room later head to the restaurant for hot lunch.

#### **LAKE NAIVASHA – CRESCENT ISLAND**

*There is just one "Crescent Island Game Sanctuary". Located on Lake Naivasha, in the Great Rift Valley, Kenya. It is one of the most beautiful parks in Kenya and is often called Naivasha best-kept secret. Surrounded by water, it is actually a peninsula and is currently only accessible by boat from the East or West side.*

*So come and spend the morning, afternoon or bring a picnic and spend the whole day with the beautiful birds and graceful animals. The shores host abundant birdlife including pelicans, cormorants, and fish-eagles with their haunting cry. There are more animals per acre than any other Kenyan Park; hence many film companies have been to the Island to film the herds of Wildebeest, Waterbuck, Zebra, and Gazelle.*

Arrive later in the afternoon in the Mara and check in at **Zebra Plains Mara Camp**

**MAASAI MARA GAME RESERVE**

*The world-renowned Masai Mara National Reserve is a huge expanse of tawny, sunburnt grasslands pocked with acacia trees and river woodlands, and heaving with animals' great and small. Impressive at any time of year, it's at its best between July and October when a million migrating wildebeest and tens of thousands of topis, zebras and other animals pour into the reserve from Tanzania in search of fresh grass. It is, arguably, the most spectacular wildlife show on the planet and the one thing that no visitor to Kenya should consider missing.*

*Reliable rains and plentiful vegetation underpin this extraordinary ecosystem and the millions of herbivores it supports. Wildebeest, zebras, impalas, elands, reedbucks, waterbucks, black rhinos, elephants, Masai giraffes and several species of gazelle all call the Mara home. Predators here include cheetahs, leopards, spotted hyenas, black-backed jackals, bat-eared foxes, caracals and the highest lion density in the world.*

**1600hrs** - After enjoying your afternoon Kenyan tea and coffee - Head out this afternoon, for an exciting game viewing adventure.

**1830hrs**- After game drive head back to your camp.

<b>Day 05 16JUL WED</b>	<b>Masai Mara Game Reserve</b>
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Full day game viewing experience in Kenya - Masai mara

Enjoy your morning and afternoon game viewing drives in the reserve.

*Masai Mara Game Reserve provides the necessary requirements to house a wide range of animal species. The most recognized are known worldwide as the African Big 5 which includes the African Elephant, Cape Buffalo, Rhinoceros, Leopard, and the King of the beasts, the Lion. The term Big 5 was coined by big-game hunters as these species were the most difficult and dangerous to track and hunt. Subsequently the term was adopted by the tourism industry for marketing purpose, spinning a web of positivity opposed to the negative effect portrait by the original terminology. Numerous other species of bird and wildlife inhabit this dynamic location including Hyenas, Gazelles, Impalas, Giraffes, Zebras, Vultures, Cranes, Eagles, Falcons, and Ostriches.*

**Day 06 17JUL THU | Masai Mara – Serengeti National Park**

**Breakfast at the camp**

After breakfast depart on your drive to Serengeti via Isebania Border with picnic lunch boxes – at the border clear with immigration for Kenya and Tanzania then proceed to swap safari vehicles and proceed with our Tanzania counterpart for the remaining part of the safari. Later arrive into central Serengeti with game viewing enroute to check in at the camp later in the evening

**SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK**

*14673sqKm of endless plains, the Serengeti National Park lies in north western Tanzania, straddling the border with Kenya. The Park encompasses half of the 30,000 sq Km Serengeti- Mara Ecosystem, a range of land defined by the limits of the Wildebeest movements throughout the year.*

*Tanzania’s oldest park, with its even more ancient landscape forged by the past volcanic activity of the several volcanoes in the nearby Ngorongoro Highlands; the rich grasses of the plains play host to the most spectacular numbers of wildlife in the world. Almost every African animal species is represented in the Serengeti, birthplace of the millions of plains game that continually circle the ecosystem. Huge granite boulders, known as kopjes, are characteristic of the park, and provide sanctuary for birds, colourful Agama lizards and sombre snakes, adorable rock hyraxes, as well as the big cats that seek shelter from the elements. Although famed for its plains, the Serengeti encompasses woodland, thorn bush, swamps and Lakes Lagaja and Magadi, supporting over 30 species of large herbivores and over 500 species of birds, including Eurasian migrants, with its diversity. The Gol and Moru Kopjes, the central Seronera area which is an oasis of springs, pools and surprisingly, palm trees, and the equally mysterious “Whistling Thorn” country- the Western Corridor which leads to the Grumeti River, home of Africa’s largest crocodiles, are some of the natural obstacles which the wildebeest and zebra encounter and must cross, during their annual migration up north towards the Masai Mara.*

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**Day 07 18JUL FRI** | **Serengeti National Park**

Have further another full day of exciting safari experience in Serengeti Safari in Swahili simply means a "journey". Nowadays it has become a synonym for wildlife viewing in the African bush. Enjoy morning and afternoon game drives with packed lunch in the endless plains of Serengeti National Park which sustain the greatest and most spectacular concentration of wildlife found anywhere in the world including great herds of wildebeest, zebras and gazelles or a pride of lions loitering in the acacia trees.

**Day 08 19JUL SAT** | **Serengeti – Ngorongoro conservation area**

Breakfast at the lodge.  
After breakfast depart with picnic lunch boxes and proceed to Ngorongoro Conservancy. Arrival into Ngorongoro and descent into the Ngorongoro Crater for a game viewing experience



**THE NGORONGORO CRATER**

The Ngorongoro Crater, the largest intact caldera in the world measuring over 600m deep and some 8-19Km in diameter, is believed to be about 8 million years old. The steep descent into the crater is almost as exciting as the scene that awaits you within the crater; a fantastic showcase of nature's best.

The diverse landscape within the crater, in which the savannah blends in to swamps, rivers, marshes, forests and cliffs, provides sanctuary for the black-maned lions, cheetahs, buffalos, elephants, and leopards that live side by side with thousands of wildebeest, gazelles and zebras, both black-backed and golden jackals. The Crater is also home to some of Tanzania's last remaining rhinos. Flamingos and hippos inhabit the alkaline lakes and fresh water pools; old elephants can be seen patiently wading through the papyrus ponds, while way up, on the slopes of the crater, unique and beautiful Afro-Alpine vegetation blankets the ground in a rich green cover, occasionally hidden by the mist and fog that occurs at the rim, which stands at over 2300m.



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Later afternoon ascent to the crater rim and proceed to the lodge for check in, dinner and overnight

### ARUSHA

*It's brash, it's colorful, it's full of energy. Some call it a dusty town, while others find it a breath of fresh air, with its green patches and views of Mount Kilimanjaro.*

*Welcome to Arusha, the gateway to the popular safari circuit in northern Tanzania. Sitting snugly at the foothills of Mount Meru, the small town is surrounded by some of the most famous national parks in Africa. Virtually everyone visiting Tanzania's northern parks will stop over here, but few actually take the time to get to know it. Dig a little deeper, and you'll be surprised at what you can do in and around Arusha.*
